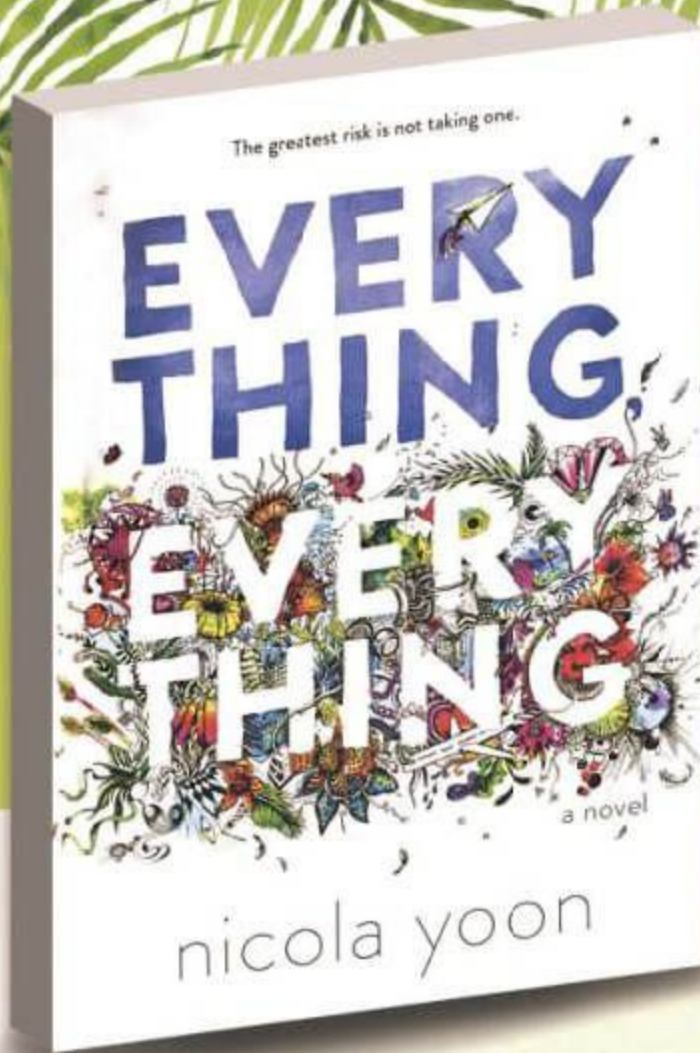

Why my dreams are only dreams

'All dreams are achievable. You are failing just because you are on the wrong track.' You might have heard these words a million times from the elders or friends. It might even seem annoying and ironic if your dreams are still distant from you at the moment, or you have already tasted the bitterness of failure numerous times. Theoretically, endless possibilities lie ahead in your future, so there is never a definite 'no' to your dreams. But undeniably, invisible barriers impede you from success. Daily practice and a positive attitude are essential elements which determine how much obstruction you will face on the path to your dreams. The less you are set back by obstacles, the more you are likely to achieve your dreams. Therefore, having a foresight of the obstacles you might be facing will lend you a hand to become a dream achiever.

No plans

Daydreaming of your dreams coming true certainly does not assist you to leap for success. No matter how small your dream is, it will not be accomplished unless you pay effort and start to make progress. UN-achievers are often too greedy and expect their dreams to be fulfilled in a short period of time. Perceiving no significant or pleasant outcome, the patience of being persistent will gradually be reduced, and finally vanish. But remember, reaching the sky in a single bound is not a typical condition in most cases. Thus, a methodical daily agenda comes in handy. Consider carefully what

you can do to move one step closer toward fulfilling your dreams every day. Stick to your daily targets rigidly and do not lose this habit once you have started, as comfort brought about by slothfulness will weaken your determination of getting back on track. When you have achieved all the time-phased goals, you are already alongside your dreams.

No confidence in yourself

How many chances do you think you have in achieving your dreams? A survey conducted in 2018-2019 by Hong Kong Life Planning Association gave answers from Hong Kong students. The survey surveyed 1108 senior secondary school students in Hong Kong. Results showed that although 69% of the students agreed that we should have courage to pursue our dreams, only 46% of the students have confidence in themselves to do so. Dreams are lifelong motivation and an ultimate target, yet they can be only insubstantial, hollow answers if you have already sentenced your dreams to death. We all have tried to estimate the possibilities of turning your own dreams to reality. True dreamers also ponder over the feasibility of fulfilling their dreams. Nevertheless, they never fear stepping forward despite knowing what difficulties they may encounter in the future. In all fairness, having uncertainty before exploring the unknown is a common phenomenon for us. But as a proverb says, 'Remember then: there is only one time that is important—Now. It is the most important time because it is the only time when we





have any power.' Most of the UN-achievers hesitate to take the first step, holding back by hypothetical difficulties they might face in the future according to their prediction. While forgetting we have no power to take hold of the future completely, we have nothing to do but strike for the best in this moment. No one can work on persistently without an affirmation, so give yourself a support and believe in your abilities. Remember, your faith is what leads you to success, not in reverse.

Your dreams are not your dreams

This reason is as strange as its name. How would you dreams not belong to you? Unfortunately, these situations are not uncommon in the crowd. Most people fail to realize that their dreams are borrowed from others. Dreams can be simply influenced by current trends and celebrities. Not to mention the fact that numerous people

lowered their heads to the unfavourable conditions of the reality, being forced to choose alternatives as their dreams. Even more pitiful, some pursue their dreams merely to obtain approval and to satisfy the desire of their important ones. For these individuals, what are so called their 'dreams' is not they would genuinely like to pursue. Passion to achieve their 'dreams' does not come from their heart but affected by external factors. Without a solid source of passion, their dedication of completing their goals will decay serially and a failure will not be avoided in the near future. Therefore, consider carefully whether your dreams are something you long for deeply in your heart, then follow its lead. Provide yourself with endless motivation and trust. We conducted a survey on 33 students to find out what most LKL girls feel about dreams achieving in general and how they set their dreams. The results are as follow:

The first question we asked was if they set time phased goals to achieve their dreams. The phrase 'time phased' means setting goals which are to be finished within a period of time. This is a hard task especially for school-goers who are busy with quizzes, homework and exams. The results showed that most students have set time phased.

We went on to ask them whether they believe everyone has the ability to achieve his dreams if he work hard.

Hard work is an important element in reaching the top as many things will drag you down on your way to success. Again, majority answered that they believed that if you work hard you will be able to achieve your dreams.

Finally, we asked them if their dreams are based on their own liking or of others.

As we know parents and peers have a big influence on how some children set their dreams. Some choose to be independent and set their dreams while some want to fulfil their parents' dreams, sacrificing theirs as a sign of respect.

We concluded that majority of the students chased their own dreams.

You can stay organised and focused on your goal, making impossible possible. Have faith in yourself and allow patience. Working hard for something you want is too tiring and you might be impatient. But remember patience may be bitter but its fruit is sweet. We would like to end by reminding you: your dreams should be your own and that you do not have to feel the need to fulfil your parents' dreams. I am sure your parents will definitely be content with your aims. Shoot for the moon, even if you miss, you will land among the stars.

I've been pursuing my dream for a long time already but I see no result. Lately I've been thinking of giving it up, what can I do to be motivated again?

1. You need to remember that your dream is not a thing you can achieve in a day or two. You need to cultivate and improve it as you grow. It may take a long time, but in the end it'll all be worth it.
2. Try looking back at why it was your dream in the first place. Maybe you wanted to be a doctor because you wanted to save people's life. Maybe you wanted to be an entertainer because you like seeing people smile. Or maybe you wanted to be a lawyer because you want to protect the weak. Whatever it may be, once you get back the rush that leads you to your dream, you'll be more likely to run towards it again.
3. Is your dream too unrealistic? If you are dreaming to be a writer, setting a goal to write a 300 page book in a month may seem like an impossible thing to do. However, if you separate it to 15 pages a week for the span of 20 weeks, it seems more doable and more motivating to do. Work on your dream everyday, no matter how small it is.
